Manga — a Japanese style of comic strip, which may be aimed at either adults or children.

Cheerleading — a sport involving organized cheering and dancing in support of a sports team.



Surfing — the sport of riding on waves while standing on a narrow board called a surfboard.



Reggae — a type of popular music with strong rhythms, developed in Jamaica in the 1960s.

Percussion instruments — musical instruments that you play by hitting them with your hand or with a stick, for example drums.



Snowmobile — a vehicle that can move over snow and ice easily.
