pane A thin piece of glass which goes in a window frame. खिड्कों में लगो

parachute (पैराशूट) A large round piece of cloth with strings attached to the edge. You use a parachute when you have to fall a long way in the sky. हवाई छत्रों (जिसके

parasole (पैरासोल) An umbrella which shades you from the sun. ভাবা ভাবা.



parcel (पार्सल) Something wrapped up in paper and tied with string or sticky tape. बंडल; पुलिन्दा.



park A large garden usually in a town. (पार्क) People and children can walk and play in a park. उद्यान; वाटिका; बगोचा.

parrot A bird with bright feathers.
(पेरट) People sometimes keep parrots as pets because you can teach them to talk, तीता.



passenger A person v (पैसेन्जर) bus, train o

A person who rides in a car, bus, train or aeroplane. यात्रो; मुसाफिर; सार्वजनिक या आम गाड़ो का सवार.

patchwork (पैचवर्क)

Lots of little pieces of material sewn together to make a pretty cover. भिन्न-भिन्न आकार तथा रंगों वाले कपड़े के दुकड़ां से
